Mas Healing is a space carved out by the CAISO: Sex and Gender Justice team for healing using our innate creative energy. Through a 2-day workshop and communal preparation for Jouvay; the workshop was designed and facilitated by Angelique Nixon, Shaden Alexander, and Shalini Seereeram.

The workshop facilitated 'healing practices' through mas-making and skill-sharing around self-care and community care. The main goal for Mas Healing is to encourage self-advocacy and empowerment for LGBTQI+ community members. Participants used their creativity as a tool for self-expression, processing emotions, grounding and balance, and recharging the spirit. They were also invited to play Jouvay as a group, with the mas they created.

# EMBRACING EVERYONE

#### **International Women's Day**

CAISO's Wholeness & Justice Programme presented for IWD 2023 a **Virtual Panel Discussion** on the Domestic Violence Act as it relates to different vulnerable groups of women in Trinidad and Tobago. At this discussion, several organisations presented perspectives from their work with vulnerable groups of women, including LBTQ, migrant and low-income women, who are survivors of domestic violence.

The discussion covered legal protections and relief available to survivors of domestic violence; how to access these protections, relief, support and resources; and organizations that provide support.

The Living Water Community and Women's Institute for Alternative Development (WINAD) were co-presenters.

We also had interpreters from CAISO's Sign Together initiative present and hard at work expanding access to all.

On Thursday 30th March 2023, CAISO hosted a Regional Community Gathering of Trans, Gender Non-Conforming and Non-Binary people.

The virtual event was divided into two related segments: the first, on mental health and well-being, facilitated by Alessandra Hereman and Wholeness and Justice Community Caseworker, Rae Alibey; and the second, entitled "Ask a Lawyer", in which Wholeness and Justice Community Lawyer, Donielle Jones, outlined laws related to Trans people.

As we concluded Women's Month and celebrated Trans Day of Visibility, we wanted to centre and support the many members of the Trans community that keep us going.

We at CAISO: Sex and Gender Justice celebrate womxn of all gender expressions, including: trans, queer, bisexual, gender-expansive, non-binary, intersex people who identify as womxn, and masculine-presenting womxn. We embrace all our differences, unique perspectives and experiences.

More than this, we are sex-positive: we believe that people should be allowed to embody, explore and learn about their gender identity and sexuality, without judgment or shame. We affirm body autonomy for all people, especially those in the struggle for reproductive and sexual rights and freedoms.
