

3RD ANNUAL LG BTQI+ ART EXHIBITION

We continued the great CAISO tradition for a third year in a row of the LGBTQI+ art Exhibition. The exhibition publicly ran from the 11th of December to 13th December at the Art Society of Trinidad and Tobago, and featured 16 artists living in Trinidad and Tobago, who submitted their work responding to our call to engage in these thematic areas:



Cocoyea Village Raid (1976)

In 1976 Police raided a house party hosted by Kelvin Mason in Cocoyea Village, San Fernando, arrested 41 gay men and a 16-year-old girl and charged them with indecent behaviour and marijuana possession. Thirty of the men were allegedly doing drag. Attendees included Raymond Choo Kong, Ronald Guy James, Arlene Karim, and Patrick Williams (nephew of then Prime Minister, Dr. Eric Williams).


